Telephone: (406) 444-2501, Fax: (406) 444-2955. To make a complaint, the following information must be obtained and reported to School Nutrition Programs:

-Complainant

-Name of person taking complaint

- Cause of complaint, including protected class that the complainant feels was discriminated against
- Dates and locations that discriminatory action(s) occurred, and the possible witnesses (other than complainant)
